From the Associate Pastor for Music and Worship

**I'm curious about something. With every relationship,** there are things to learn about one another—likes, dislikes, expressions, ways of being comfortable together, and so on. You might not realize it, but I consider these very factors when I think about planning for worship each week. I think of my relationship with you as a congregation, my relationship with you as individuals, and the relationships that I see you having with each other. With this knowledge, I plan the course of worship to compliment what I know about you, but sometimes I need to learn more about you to do my job better, hence my curiosity.

Which statement better describes you?

When I come to worship, I want to hear the scriptures, prayers, the sermon and offerings of music so I can meditate and reflect upon them. Worship is about God speaking to me.

OR

When I come to worship, I hear the scriptures, prayers, the sermon and offerings of music, and I want to share it with my neighbor in the pew. Worship is about God speaking to all of us.

**By writing this, I don't say that either statement is better or worse than the other.** They are differences of mindset and both are valid. Personally, I come to our worship services to know how God is speaking to all of us and not just to me. Because of my mindset, when I am leading in song, I look to see how God is speaking to you through that song. I look for faces and eyes and expressions that show how your heart is being touched that day—those are important to me because they encourage me in my work each week. Verbal feedback after a service is always appreciated, but I want you to know that even better than that, I enjoy the gleam in your eyes, the smile on your faces, or the gentle tear on your cheek as we worship together. (You are good at disguising them, but I do look and find them from time to time. ☺)

Now you know a little more about me, what can and should I know about you?
