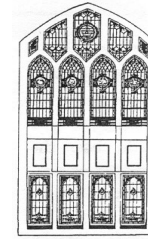

#### **PREPARING FOR CORPORATE WORSHIP**

Last Sunday, as we observed Trinity Sunday, we begin our lengthy journey through the season of Ordinary Time. "Rather than meaning 'common' or 'mundane,' this term comes from the word 'ordinal,' which simply means *counted time*. Counted time after Pentecost always begins with Trinity Sunday (the first Sunday after Pentecost) and ends with Christ the King Sunday (the last Sunday before the beginning of Advent)."

"The Sundays of Ordinary Time are used to focus on various aspects of the Faith, especially the mission of the church in the world. The Lectionary readings for these Sundays tend to be semi-continuous readings through certain sections of Scripture, especially through the Synoptic Gospel of the year, Luke for Year C. The color for Ordinary Time is green, a color traditionally associated with new life and growth." —Christian Resource Institute
