

#### For Your Consideration . . .

Twice, in recent weeks, I have been asked about my vision for First Baptist Church Ahoskie. I am grateful to have been pushed a bit to think about a vision for our church. Through my experience as a pastor, however, I have learned that my vision for the future may not be the vision of the larger congregation. And, furthermore, if a large percentage of the congregation does not embrace a similar vision for the church, it usually does not materialize. So, in my first column as your pastor-elect, I would like to propose the following as a vision for the future of our church for your consideration.

My vision for our church is based on something I've experienced elsewhere. In fact, I've been carrying this picture of church with me for 27 years. I attended Black Creek Baptist Church, in Mechancisville, Va., in the early 1990s. Though I did not join the church, because I was then in college and thus living in another state the majority of the year, I was baptized by Black Creek Baptist Church. The church sanctuary was sacred ground for me. I remember feeling the Holy in our midst during worship. I remember practical preaching from the pulpit. I can still see the sanctuary filled with people. I can still hear enthusiastic singing (from a hymn book!) that left me feeling that I was in the company of people who sincerely believed that we were singing, not to one another, but to the God who had revealed himself through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

I know, of course, that Black Creek Baptist, afflicted with the human condition as all churches are, had its problems. I have no doubt that there was some degree of conflict in the congregation. Nonetheless, this church was characterized by less apathy and a larger percentage of congregational participation than any other church I have been a part of. In other words, as I look back on my experiences with this congregation, it seems that more people sincerely cared and therefore more people participated. In the 1990s Black Creek Baptist Church was a vibrant congregation. When other churches were declining and dying, Black Creek was growing in Christian discipleship as well as in number.

During my six years at Chowan, I've struggled the most to help the student who just does not care—the student who puts her head down on the desk throughout class, the student who does not even attempt the essay question which is worth 50 points, the student who refuses to take notes. Churches are similar. If a large percentage of the church is apathetic, authentic discipleship and evangelical growth are difficult to accomplish.

First Baptist Ahoskie, though in a state of numerical decline, has much life left. This excites me. I find the current vitality of the church attractive, attractive enough to serve as your pastor. We have a foundation on which to build (or rebuild). If we are to do so, however, we will need a larger percentage of our congregation to care enough to become more faithful in attendance, more generous in giving, and more diligent in contributing to the work of the church.

What do you think? Is this a vision that you can embrace? If so, I look forward to the hard work that is necessary in order to participate in a vibrant church. If not, what is your vision for the future of our church? This is an important question for us all to ponder.
