We did it! In fact, we reached our Preservation (Phase I) Capital Campaign Goal early. Our church has already donated or pledged to give \$354,145.53 by the end of 2018. Your Capital Campaign Committee of Lyndsay Britt, Austine Evans, Charles Hughes, Louis Mizelle, Walt Pierce, and Bonnie Revelle want to thank you for your devoted and quick response to the immediate restoration needs that we face. As most of you know, our original Co-Chair, Louis Mizelle, moved to Chapel Hill to be near his family, and felt that it would be in our best interest for him to resign from this committee. His contributions were extraordinary, and we will certainly miss Louis, but we are delighted that Charles has agreed to serve as Co-Chair, and that Penny Rose will be joining the Committee.

This church family faithfully responded to the call to contribute to the preservation of this beautiful church structure that has been entrusted to us for the worship and work of God. To date, we have actually received \$264,829.28 and have \$89,316.25 outstanding. It is important to remember that we need to fulfill each of our pledges so that by the end of 2018 we will have received all of the funds for Phase I.

Let me remind you what our collective generosity has allowed us to do.

- •We have made significant repairs to the roof over the sanctuary for \$71,849.27.
- •The West Street sidewalk has been replaced at the cost of \$17,190.
- •We have paved the West Street parking lot with a gift in kind of \$7,800.
- •Two pieces of property adjoining the church have been purchased, and a house on one of these prop- Continuing your generosity, erties has been demolished, all of which cost The Capital Campaign Committee \$82,596.54.

- From the Capital Campaign Committee •We have power washed the façade of the sanctuary for \$9,925.
 - •We are in the process of repairing, caulking, painting, and in some cases replacing windows in our sanctuary and education building, estimated to cost \$20,000.
 - •We will be able to set aside a fund of roughly \$60,000 for the repair and/or replacement of airconditioning units when the need arises.
 - •We will have available about \$60,000 to evaluate and correct the flooding problem in our education building.

What's next? It is PREPARATION for the bright future of our church and our missions. Now that we can see our way through the stabilization of our church building, we can begin to dream. We have heard you mention:

- •Renovating or constructing a Fellowship Hall and
- •Removing the carpet from the main floor of the sanctuary in order to improve acoustics.
- •Replacing the carpet and seats in the balcony.
- •Renovating several bathrooms.
- •Improving the lighting under the balcony.
- •Establishing a green space to include a play yard for children and youth activities.
- •Building a back or side driveway with a covered portico entrance for our members and guests who need better access to our elevator and children's wing.

As your Capital Campaign Committee begins planning for the next phase of our campaign, we want to hear your thoughts. What capital changes do you envision that will help us prepare for a future of growth and Christian service?
