#### That Was Easy!

I invited someone to church recently. And it was easy, effortless really! I admit I was a bit surprised. Sometimes, asking can be intimidating. Not this time, however. Let me tell you all about it and why I think the experience was so natural.

I was in a restaurant and I saw a friend. We are not bffs (best friends forever). However, through my time in our area, I have had several significant conversations with him. Most often we talk politics. And, as it so happens, our politics align quite nicely. While I think Steve knows my line of work, we have never had a conversation about faith. During this recent encounter, I felt inspired to bring up faith, but in a safe manner. So, I said, "Steve, are you a church going kind of guy?" He shook his head from right to left and said, "Naw." I then replied, "Well, I serve a good congregation. We would love to have you visit First Baptist Ahoskie." Because I know him well, I then added, "And we will not ask for any money your first four Sundays!" We laughed and then went on with our conversation about politics.

I would like to ask you to be sensitive to opportunities to invite people to church which, though it did not happen in the case described above, might lead to an even deeper discussion about your belief in Jesus the Christ. Furthermore, I would like to encourage you with a reality I have experienced many times: whether we simply invite someone to church or go deeper with a discussion about our own encounter with Christ, the sharing of our Christian faith can be very natural, even easy! As we get to know people, we share our lives with each other. We listen to their stories and they listen to our stories. You likely know if a person you talk with on a regular basis favors Duke or Chapel Hill. You likely know how many children that person has. You may even know the condition of their

parent's health. So, why not talk church and faith? In relationships, we win the right to be heard – to share what matters most to us. As important as ACC basketball is, there are matters in this life of greater importance! Agreed?

An old-fashioned invitation to church is still vital, even in our plugged-in society. I remind you of why this is still so. When in church, what God has done for us through the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ takes center stage. This does not happen anywhere else. When people come to church they are exposed to this very good news. In addition, on a practical plane, if a church is to survive from one generation to the next there must be new faces because people die every day. As you have heard me say before, I very much approve of our current church growth strategy — reproduction! Nonetheless, at some point I suspect our birth rate will slow.

So, in an effort to expose our neighbors such as Steve to the faith that has brought us meaning, forgiveness, abundant life and eternal life; and in an effort to keep the mission of First Baptist Ahoskie alive and well for generations to come, let us all invite folks we know and love to church this Sunday!


#### Thursday, March 29 6:00 pm Maundy Thursday Supper and Communion Service
