## Christian Women's Job Corps News from Pat Byrd, Director

It is so exciting to be able to share that one of our Christian Women's Job Corps (CWJC) participants, Akevia Wilson, has received the 2018 National dowment provides a grant each year to the Dove Award recipient, helping a current or former CWJC student become independent and enhance her ability to nurture the development of her children. Akevia has just graduated from Chowan University with an A average and a degree in Education. Let me share her testimony written a few months ago:

school I was considered at-risk due to poverty and being raised in a single parent home. This resulted with me working two jobs to survive, and I ended up a college dropout by the age of 19.

Fast forward a few years. I worked hard at deadend jobs throughout my early twenties until I experienced a significant loss of a loved one. This death led me into a deep depression to the point where I could not work or even function daily. I was left homeless, pregnant, and hopeless.

But . . . the Lord led me to Britton Ministries in Ahoskie NC. Britton Ministries is transitional housing for single mothers run by the Baptist Children's Home. Once there I met Pat Byrd and entered Roanoke Chowan Christian Women's Job Corps. CWJC helped me with encouragement, school, clothes, classes, items for my son, bible study, and many other things. Everyone's help enabled me to go to the local community college to add to some of my class needs and move me closer to my goal of one day having a teaching degree. Once I had all the classes I could get at the community college, the questions were. Pat Byrd

"Where and how can I reach my goal and earn my teaching degree?"

Mrs. Byrd and I looked at all the surrounding colleges, Elizabeth City State in Elizabeth City, ECU in Greenville, and close by was Chowan University, CWJC Sybil Bentley Dove Award. The Dove En- a Baptist University. Chowan seemed out of reach, but Mrs. Byrd called someone and we made an appointment to check out the possibilities.

I thought it was impossible, but with God all things are possible, and I began at Chowan. I worked parttime, worked in the summer, and did whatever it took. After the first year, I thought there were roadblocks as I searched for scholarships, loans and I started college many, many years ago. All through grants to finish school. However, again God had an answer. I received several scholarships, assistance, money for books, and help with transportation.

> I am a few months away from reaching my goal in May 2018 and becoming what and who I was destined to be. God has used my journey to strengthen my faith. Because of these organizations and the wonderful Christian people who have helped and encouraged us, my son, Mark Jeremiah, will not have to experience food insecurity or homelessness. Generational poverty ended with me because of all of you.

Thank you, FBC church family for your support of the CWJC ministry. With your help, we are loving our neighbors as ourselves by providing ward self-sufficiency, and a full and rich life.
