From the Pastor

12 Sundays?

Pentecost Sunday was such a joy. I do not think I have ever experienced such a meaningful Pentecost. Our sanctuary was decorated with the colors of fire (red, yellow, and orange) because we are told in Acts 2 that tongues as of fire appeared to the disciples with the coming of the Holy Spirit. Our evening choral concert and birthday party for the church, coupled with our morning worship, had me high on the church – so proud to be a part of the universal church of Jesus the Christ and proud, once again, to serve as pastor to First Baptist Church.

As a result of this high that I experienced on Pentecost, I would like to follow up on my Pentecost sermon – "Life to life" from Ezekiel's account on the valley of dry bones. During this sermon, I suggested that the Spirit of God gives LIFE to life. That is, life with the Spirit is richer and more satisfying than a life not submitted to the Spirit of God. When compared with life in the Spirit, life outside of the Spirit is like a valley of dry bones.

Since the church is designed to assist us as we seek to live a life in the Spirit, it is imperative to the Christian life that we give high priority to our participation in the church. Yet we live in a day and time when wider cultural patterns do not make it easy for us to do this. The days of protestant privilege – when most businesses closed on Sunday and schools would never schedule an activity on a church night – are behind us. So, this means we must work a bit harder to give church participation / life in the Spirit the high priority it deserves.

To help us do this, I would like to issue a friendly pastoral challenge. Will you commit, for the next year, to miss no more than one (1) Sunday a

month? This means, for the entire year you will do your best to miss no more than twelve (12) Sundays. I would love to get at least 30 people to accept this invitation!

I am very curious what this will do for our church. Likely, our weekly average attendance will increase. I've noticed though the years a sanctuary that feels full leaves people feeling good. However, more important than higher attendance numbers, I suggest more people of First Baptist will live lives that are more pleasing to God. And I suggest our lives will feel less and less like dry bones and more and more ALIVE as God, through Christ, intends. We will move from living life to living LIFE.

So, what do you think? Will you sign the dotted line to miss no more than 12 Sundays for one year? Of course, there is no dotted line to sign! And, if you should miss 13 Sundays, there will be no handcuffs. However, I am curious concerning the benefits that meeting this challenge might bring to your life and to our life together as First Baptist Church. Are you curious too? Some of you have asked how you can help with the North St. House. Here are some items we need. Perhaps you or your Sunday School class, WMU group, or friend group would like to pick an item, or adopt the needs in one room, etc. So that we don't duplicate items, please indicate your contribution on the list on 2nd floor bulletin board.

I am specific about a few items, like towels, because each family will be given specific colored towels for their room, so we know which towels belong to which family. I have given a choice of colors for each room; please choose just one. For example, Bedroom 1 needs all the towels and wash cloths to be either beige, purple, or lavender, not a combination of those colors.

Bedroom 1

- •Alarm clock •One full blanket
- •4 towels and washcloths (beige, purple, or lavender)
- •Laundry hamper (stands upright). Plastic ones with wheels found at Walmart are perfect.

Bedroom 2

- •Alarm Clock •3 twin blankets, same colors if possible
- •4 towels and washcloths (black or grey)
- •Laundry hamper (stands upright). Plastic ones with wheels found at Walmart are perfect.

Bedroom 3

- •Alarm clock •3 twin blankets, same colors if possible
- •4 towels and washcloths (yellow or brown)
- •Laundry hamper (stands upright). Plastic ones with wheels found at Walmart are perfect.

Bathroom

- •Toilet brush and holder —•Toilet plunger
- •Shower rod (spring loaded) Shower curtain

Kitchen

- •Dishcloths —•Toaster (4-slices) •Wall clock
- •Dishtowels —Set of cutting knives •Pot holders —

Other Items

- •Iron •3 Outside doormats •Clock for living room
- •Ironing board •3 Inside doormats •Chairs and/or swing for porch
- 3 Baskets with handles; large enough for a resident to carry toiletries from bedroom to bathroom, *Since residents will share a bathroom, personal items cannot be left in the bathroom.*
