Early Results?

Our 12 Sundays challenge has not officially started. However, I think we are already experiencing early



ready experiencing early results. I do not know for sure, of course. However, my curiosity is peaked. Have you noticed that summer worship attendance has not been bad? The professor in me suggests we let the numbers speak. Last year, from August (when we began counting) to December, we averaged 160.65 people in Sunday morning worship. This year, our current average for Sunday morning worship stands at 161.18 people. Now, notice our average worship attendance for May, June, and July of this year: 154.08 people.

There has been no major summer dip! We have averaged 7.1 less people through the summer months. This is not bad; in fact, I have been pleasantly surprised. The obvious question: why has there been no major summer dip in worship attendance?

Well, I do not know. I do know, however, that there has been much discussion around our 12 Sundays challenge that begins August 19. I have so enjoyed the banter. Here is a sampling of comments I've heard: "I've not missed 12 Sundays in my life!", "Perhaps, I should try for 15 Sundays first!", "If I am present for five Wednesday nights, can I have an extra Sunday?", "Does listening on the radio count?", and "Can I get half-credit for listening on the radio?".

I am hopeful that our 12 Sundays challenge is going to be a success. I am hopeful that it will assist us in moving the church of Jesus the Christ more to the center of our lives instead of, where it often dwells, on the periphery of our lives. I am hopeful that, because of this challenge, more and more

people will choose church participation over other competing activities. I am hopeful that the church will win more and loose less in the lives of Christians. I am hopeful that a deep appreciation and affection for the church will take root in the lives of our people. I am hopeful that First Baptist will avoid the status of yet another once strong congregation on the decline. I am hopeful that our congregation will view participation in the life of the church of Jesus the Christ as the privilege that it is – we are a people that have received abundant life in the here and now and eternal life in the future through the forgiveness of God granted in Christ. Most of all, I am hopeful that we will become more committed disciples of Jesus the Christ.

I cannot see the future. Perhaps the current cultural trends are so strong that they cannot be contested. However, the summer months at First Baptist this year give me reason for optimism. I am very curious about what First Baptist will look like beginning August 19. As it now stands, 56 people have committed to try to miss no more than 12 Sundays for the year. Can we add your name to the list?
