#### THANK YOU!

Please know how pleased I was (and am) with our "Get Everybody Here Day" / "12 Sundays Challenge" kickoff on August 19. My official counter and our organist tells me we had 225 people in worship. Thank you for putting forth such effort to mark this day with such a high level of participation. I am especially grateful to the hostess committee for a delicious and expertly organized meal. It was a joy to see our fellowship hall overflowing with people enjoying one another's company. There was good energy and a sweet spirit all around.

Going forward, I want to encourage us with a brief summary of last Sunday's sermon (August 26). In Revelation 2:1-7, the resurrected Christ commends the Ephesian church for many good qualities. They do not tolerate evil. They stand firm in the midst of persecution they suffer for the name of Christ. They reject the influence of false messengers and messages. Yet, the resurrected Christ rebukes the Ephesian Christians because they left their first love. It is not clear exactly what their first love was. Was it Christ himself? Was it their love for one another? We do not know. However, it does appear that the rebuke has something to do with fading passion as the resurrected Christ instructs the Ephesians to do the deeds they once did.

I am hopeful that going forward we can bottle the enthusiasm and passion that was present in our sanctuary and fellowship hall on August 19. It is a challenge to maintain passion over the long haul. However, I think this is exactly what the Ephesian church is challenged with in Revelation 2. And, I sense that this is the challenge before us now. It takes work and it takes effort to maintain a passionate career, a passionate marriage, and a passionate church. If we will continue to give First Baptist the priority and love that we gave on the

19th, our church will indeed buck the trend of churches on the decline.

I am very optimistic that we are on this trajectory – the trajectory of overcoming the odds and existing as a vibrant church even in a culture that competes with rather than complements the church's ministries. I am not angry at the culture. It is simply that we Christians need to stand, and not buckle, as we move about in contemporary American culture.

My optimism about First Baptist is based on evidence. Among other items, I understand we had 17 children in extended session, during worship, last Sunday August 26th. We had 170 people in worship. I interpret this evidence to mean that our people are moving the church more to the center of their lives. And this is beautiful to watch because repeated exposure to the gospel is a bulwark against racism, sexism, greed, and all other sins. We need the church to enable us to love our neighbor in faithfulness to the revelation of God in Christ.

It is my great joy to serve as your pastor!
