Checking In on the 12 Sundays Challenge

So, how is it going with the 12 Sundays Challenge? A quick glance at our worship participation numbers indicates that many of our people are on track so far! Since we started this challenge on August 19, we have averaged 188 people in worship on Sunday mornings. This number is roughly 28 people more than before the challenge began. Fantastic!

I do not know. However, I suspect we have a sizeable handful of folks who are closet challenge takers. That is, though we have 75 people officially signed up, others have decided to try and miss no more than 12 Sundays for the next year; even though they have not made their decision public to me or, perhaps, anyone else. Fantastic!

I will be pleased if this challenge in some ways reflects the challenges of physical exercise. A few months back, to get my exercise in, I used 20- to 30-minute workout routines found on the web. The leaders – a husband and wife team – exhorted me to make the necessary adjustments to their suggested practices. For example, when they instructed me to increase the amount of weight I was lifting, I was to do so only if I felt I could handle the increase. Otherwise, I was to keep the current weight in hand, or even decrease the weight.

So, wherever you are on your journey, the goal is to get us moving in a forward direction. The goal is to increase the priority we give to the church. Some of you have said, "Trey, I never miss 12 Sundays in a year." Well, make it six Sundays then! For other people (perhaps reading this newsletter), it would be an improvement to attend only 12 Sundays in a year. If you have fallen out of the habit of worship participation, start by trying to make it to First Baptist 12 Sundays – just one Sunday a month!

I must say our sanctuary has been beautiful in recent weeks with so many (more) people gathered for the worship of God. Beyond the appealing atmosphere of a well-populated sanctuary, I hope you are experiencing the results that can come with frequent and consistent worship participation. I pray that you feel more grounded as a new week begins. I pray you find refreshment in the act of singing praises to God with other believers. And I pray the instruction that comes from the Scriptures each week strengthens your resolve to be faithful to Christ in your day-to-day living. Furthermore, I pray that your marriages are strengthened and that your children are better equipped to handle the pressures of adolescence. All of this can result from following through on a commitment to faithful worship participation!

In closing, I thank each of you for providing me with such an encouraging working environment. While I have had good experiences in my previous ministry settings, I have never served a church where I sense that pastor and congregation speak the same language to the extent that we do. As I carry out my pastoral duties each week – visiting people in their home and in the hospital, preparing sermons and Bible studies, and leading our exceptionally gifted staff – I feel your prayers and I hear your words of edification.
