## Good News!

I have good news to share! Over a month ago, in a sermon from Revelation 2:18-29, I made known my desire to identify another mission project. There is wide-spread agreement that the North Street house renovation, for use by Christian Women's Job Corps, was not only good for the ladies who now live in the house, but the project was also very good for our church. A church fulfills its mission by loving God and neighbor. There is great satisfaction when the church does what the church is supposed to do!

In that sermon, I asked you to consider the need we have to refine our benevolence ministry. As it now stands, people come to the church office seeking assistance of some sort. They may need help with their electric bill, water bill, or the purchase of medication. Anita or I will meet with the person. We have an intake form that we fill out. This process helps us to better discern the person's need. Anita and I then decide what to do.

I affirm the church's role in assisting the needy – it is biblical! Furthermore, there is historical precedent, going back into the early layers of Christianity, for the practice of clergy distributing financial resources to the poor. However, there are problems with our practice as it stands now. 1) We do the best we can; however, neither Anita or I are trained to assist people in this fashion. 2) The process of meeting with people, while rewarding, is also time consuming. There are some days that we spend all morning with benevolence needs. This investment of time takes us away from what we are trained to do: prepare and lead in worship, provide pastoral care, and administer the day-to-day running of the church. 3) Our benevolence ministry currently serves as a band aid. While a band aid is indeed better than nothing, it would be nice to do more.

What if we could counsel people on how to better manage their finances? What if we could refer people to alcohol and drug recovery programs when needed? What if we had knowledge of the area resources available to help persons rebound from unfortunate circumstances and bad decisions?

During that sermon, I also asked the congregation to enter into discussion concerning how to improve our ministry to low-income people in our community. Due to the discussions that followed, this has emerged: Anna and LaCount Anderson, Cooperative Baptist Fellowship missionaries to Northeast North Carolina through Together for Hope, will be in Ahoskie on Tuesdays beginning November 13 from 10am to 3pm. They will set up shop in the youth building across the street from our sanctuary to meet with benevolence clients. As the focus of Together for Hope is poverty in rural America, Anna and LaCount are uniquely qualified to lead us in the refinement process of our benevolence ministry.

I am over the moon about this development. Please join me in praying for the successful refinement of our benevolence outreach. And please begin to consider a call from God to learn from Anna and LaCount so that you too might get involved with our low-income neighbors who are made in the image of God.
