Your Place

In recent years, it has become commonplace for churches to offer two worship services on Sundays. Usually, the earlier Sunday worship service is styled contemporary worship. And, usually, the second worship service is referred to as traditional. This practice of two Sunday morning worship offerings developed, in most cases, not due to an overcrowded sanctuary. In other words, the people who participated in both services could fit (often easily) in the sanctuary at the same time. Rather, this practice developed due to demands for different styles of worship.

Lately, I have encountered three different churches who either have already gone back to a single worship service on Sunday mornings, or are making plans to return to a single worship offering. Why the reversal? I cannot speak for all three churches. However, I did speak with the pastor of one church. He informed me that his church's sanctuary holds 900 people. The pastor tells me that on a low Sunday, they have 150 people in the early service and 200-300 people in the traditional service. He asked me, "If you were visiting on one of those Sundays, what would you think?" I responded, "Not much is happening around here." He said, "Right, the wagons are beginning to circle—this church's days are numbered."

Indeed, how things look and how things feel are important to the vitality of a church.

Therefore, I remind you of the importance of finding your place in our sanctuary for the worship of God each Sunday morning. Many people are aware that the neglect of gathering for worship with other believers is a detriment to their wellbeing. I frequently hear something along these lines, "Trey, I just don't feel right when I miss a Sunday." Gath-

ering for worship on the sabbath provides us with a strong foundation upon which to stand for the following six days.

However, there is more at stake when you fall short in your responsibility to participate in Sunday morning worship. Your absence has a ripple effect. When your place is empty it is noticeable to everyone else. When several people, or many people as sometimes happens, do not find their place in worship on Sunday morning, it begins to look like the wagons are circling. This atmosphere is not good for me – my pastor friend above referred to it as "preaching to wood" – or the larger congregation. Indeed, we do have folks visiting with us. Are you aware that we have a gentleman who drives from Hampton, Va. every Sunday to worship with us? We truly want to put our best foot forward in relation to our visitors.

If you are a member of FBC Ahoskie, please monitor closely how many Sundays you miss. When you are not in your place for worship on Sundays, not only is it bad for you; your absence also has negative consequences for our church as a whole.
