20%

I read recently that, on average, Sunday morning worship participation drops 20% during the summer months. If my math is correct, our summer drop is right at this 20% number. During January through May of this year, we averaged 190.45 people participating in Sunday morning worship. During the month of June, we averaged 157.8 people participating in worship. For the month of June, we averaged 17.14% fewer people in worship. And we still have July to go.

I remind you, during the heat of the summer slump, that it is *very* important for us to keep our eyes on worship participation numbers. It is *very* important for you to keep your eye on how many Sundays you and your family miss. I have suggested that each church member make it their goal to miss no more than one Sunday per month, or 12 Sundays in a year. If FBC Ahoskie church members are not *very* attentive to how much church they miss, a conversation like this is likely in five years: One person says to another, over lunch at an area restaurant, "I was at First Baptist Ahoskie last Sunday morning for my granddaughter's baptism. Would you believe, in that big sanctuary, there were only 27 people?"

Our church is *very* vulnerable to decline. We must not let our guard down. If we do, the results will be disastrous for the future vitality of our church. I like living in our area of the world – northeastern, NC. We have the Chowan River in our backyard, beaches just a couple of hours away, and big cities one to two hours away. However, Ahoskie is not a big city. We do not have an influx of people to attract to our church. Furthermore, our church seeks to be faithful to the good news of Jesus the Christ during a time when people simply do not participate in the life of a church with the frequency and attention they once did. Add to all this a good economy and our church steps up to the plate with two

strikes against us before the first pitch is thrown.

Therefore, if you are a member of FBC Ahoskie it is very important that you raise the level of your commitment to our church. I issue this challenge not only in terms of Sunday morning worship participation but also in terms of wider service. What abilities do you have that can be used to the glory of God within our faith community - teaching, hospitality, singing in the choir, church facilities maintenance, etc. We need more and more of our people rearranging their calendars in support of church worship services and activities. We need people planning vacations around our summer day camp. We need people coming back from trips in time to participate in Sunday morning worship. We need people deciding to leave to visit family after worship on Sunday instead of before.

Add a few more babies and a sensitivity to inviting new people to be a part of our faith family to a high level of commitment from our church members, and we will be in good shape in five years. If not, there might be 27 people gathered in our sanctuary for a baptismal service.


