Let's Do It Again!

So, how did it go? The 12 Sundays Challenge that is – how did it go for you? We started the 12 Sundays Challenge on August 19, 2018. A significant number of people decided to sign up for the challenge. I still have the list in my desk drawer! I have no way to know how many people decided to give the challenge a go but did not make their decision public. However, I am pleased that some chose to go undercover as well.

The goal of the 12 Sundays Challenge was to miss no more than 12 Sunday morning worship services in the sanctuary of First Baptist Church of Ahoskie for one year. While the final numbers for August are yet to be determined, here is a comparison of our average number of worship participants for each month prior to the start of the 12 Sundays Challenge and then each month during the 12 Sundays Challenge:

In light of the above numbers, let's do it again beginning August 25! I am making a list (and checking it twice!) once again this year. If you would like to sign up for the 12 Sundays Challenge, beginning August 25, let me know (text, email, phone, in person). I am hopeful that everyone who committed to the challenge last year will do so again this year. And I am hopeful that our list will grow this year with a nice number of new people making the commitment to miss no more than twelve Sundays in the coming year.

A quick reminder as to why we do this: First, the gathering together for the worship of God is what makes the church distinct from every and any other organization. Worship is the most important activity that the church of Jesus the Christ carries out. Second, the consistent gathering together of God's people

for worship leads to mature Christian discipleship. Finally, if First Baptist is to avoid existence as yet another once significantly larger church in a state of rapid decline, we must recommitment ourselves regularly to faithfulness to the church. In other words, and more bluntly, if we are to avoid a future Sunday morning baptismal service with only 27 people in our sanctuary we must keep a close eye on how much church we miss.


