Lessons from a Strange Sunday

*** the purpose of this piece is not to fuss; rather the purpose is to challenge us to think of church as family where the actions of one impact the rest ***

Those of us who preach on Sunday mornings do not like to see rain as we make our way to the meeting house. When I crossed the Potecasi last Sunday morning, October 20, reality sat in as the rain poured down my windshield. The following dialogue emerged in my head, "Lots of people will stay home today", "Maybe not as FBC Ahoskie often surprises me", "If this were a basketball game people would still come", "You cannot blame the elderly for staying home because they might fall and hurt themselves", "It's not usually the elderly who stay home."

Around 9:30am, I took my place at the big red doors near the columbarium and greeted folks as they entered for Sunday School. I was encouraged. I found myself greeting our young married couples and their children. I helped some of our senior adults on to the elevator. The parking lot didn't look bad. However, things are not always as they seem.

When I walked into our sanctuary for 11am worship, I was met with many empty spaces and little chatter. A wave of disappointment came over me. As our time together in worship progressed my disappointment lessened a bit. I noticed that the choir loft was full. Well done choir! A handful of late arrivers entered the sanctuary. Thank God for late arrivers! The balcony looked good. However, the space between the choir loft and the balcony was lacking in people. Later in the day, I received the actual number of people present for worship. Ouch!

I've learned something from this strange Sunday – a Sunday that initially looked like participation

might be good even with the rain but, in the end, was not. When we are not physically present for worship – even if there is a good reason for our absence – it hurts the church. I've listened back to my sermon from last Sunday. And it sounds like I recovered well from my disappointment. Nonetheless, others felt disappointment too. Someone suggested we had more people for Geraldine Tucker's memorial service Sunday afternoon than we did for Sunday morning worship. Maybe so. A sparse sanctuary causes pain because our *family* is not together.

Two weeks ago, *I* missed worship with our congregation. I was invited back by the first church I served as pastor to preach at the church's homecoming service. It was a good reason to be absent. However, my absence hurt our church. There was one less person in worship. Therefore, there was a little less vibrancy than there would have been if I were with my church *family*.

Please be aware that when you are absent from worship – even for a good reason – your absence (and mine) hurts the church. Therefore, we want to keep absences – for whatever reason – to a bare minimum.
