Youth

Our new youth ministry foundation is laid. And it appears to be rock solid! As you are aware, our church has been in transition in relation to how we will provide Christian discipleship opportunities for our young folks – grades 6 through 12. After considerable discussion and prayer, here is where we landed.



The youth group has two opportunities to gather together each week. First, there is Sunday School each Sunday morning at 10am. We have a group of caring Christian adults who rotate teaching responsibilities each Sunday. The emphasis for Sunday School is to teach our youth the basic narrative of the Bible. Second, Lou Ann Gilliam now leads a youth group meeting each Wednesday night at 6pm. The youth first gather at a table in our fellowship hall in order to share a meal and conversation. They then make their way up to the youth room for some sort of activity. The focus on Wednesday nights is the activity. Lou Ann tells me the goal is to keep them busy and to slip in a little Jesus! Last week and this week, for example, the youth are putting together benches for Easterseals what a nice local mission project.

Our Sunday School teachers, Anita and I have taken responsibility to lead a monthly activity for our youth. You may remember that I took our youth roller skating in October. That was fun! This coming Sunday evening (November 24), Anita has planned a pizza and movie night at Avery Byrum's house. Our goal then is to provide a group activity, away from our church facilities, once a month.

Finally, we will continue the annual Passport youth experience. Passport is a highly successful Christian retreat experience offered during the summer months when kids are out of school. I am pleased that our youth have developed a rather rich Passport tradition. In fact, on a recent outing with our children, one of our children informed me that she couldn't wait to go to Passport! In our staff meeting this week, we spent considerable time making plans for Passport this summer. You will hear more about Passport summer plans soon! I feel confident about the structure from which our church now carries out ministry to youth. In fact, what developed exceeded my initial expectations. Will you join me in prayer that our youth group will develop a strong bond, that our young people will truly care for one another, and that they will seek to build their lives on the rock-solid foundation of Jesus' teachings?




