



6:00 pm Meal 6:45pm Service of Worship

We begin the Season of Lent dining and worshiping together. After enjoying a delicious meal in our fellowship hall, we'll move to the sanctuary where we'll engage in a time of reflection and confession as we observe the tradition of the imposition of ashes.

Ash Wednesday falls 46 days before Easter Sunday and marks the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent is traditionally a 40-day period — a reference to the time Jesus spent being tempted in the desert — that seeks to prepare the heart for the solemn remembrance of Jesus' death. It concludes and is followed by a joyous Easter Sunday celebration of the resurrection of Christ.
