The Service of Tenebrae follows a tradition dating back to the eighth century. From Latin, the word Tenebrae means "darkness" or "shadows" and commemorates the final hours of our Lord's life on earth, as He suffered death on the cross. Candles are gradually extinguished symbolizing the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. It also reminds us of our participation in the death of Christ through our sins. The final candle, representing Christ, is removed at the conclusion of the service symbolizing His death. The service ends in darkness.
