# Sanctuary Worship During the Coronavirus Pandemic

These are strange and different days. I just retuned from the graveside service for Bob Newsome. On the one hand, it was nice to see so many First Baptist people. On the other hand, I left the Ahoskie cemetery with a lack of closure. We all had to stand far apart from one another. In fact, I felt rude at a different graveside service when I had to remind someone, who extended his hand to greet me, that shaking hands, at this time, carries with it a degree of risk. He meant no harm of course. It was just southern culture reflex. Even so, after our graveside memorial service for Bob was complete, I was unable to shake hands, much less hug Dot and the rest of the family.

Pastoral ministry is so different now.

And so it is in our church sanctuary on Sunday mornings – different, very different. As you know, a handful of us gather in the sanctuary each Sunday and lead worship. Everyone is invited to join us in worship via Facebook Live and/or the radio station. Overall, this arrangement has gone well. I like that worship is still live. I like that our outreach has expanded. Have you noticed that we now have over 500 people in our Facebook community? I have no way to estimate how many people are a part of our radio congregation.

However, last Sunday (4-19-2020) demonstrates how different things are in our sanctuary. I missed Anita's children's time because I had to leave the platform to receive further instruction about the nature of our technical difficulties. I am not a proficient lip reader! Passing the offering plate continues to be awkward with ten people. I much prefer a smooth transition from the doxology into the scripture reading for the day's sermon. However,

last Sunday I had to give directions to help resolve our technical difficulties. I am doing my best. However, I am still not sure how to lead us into the hymn of commitment with 95% of our congregation in Facebook and radio land. Do you remember several weeks ago when the Facebook Live camera fell off the tripod mid service? Augh!

Nonetheless, there were high points last Sunday for which I am extremely grateful. First, Leah Woodard made a profession of Christian faith and, upon her baptism, will be a member of FBC Ahoskie. Over the past three weeks, six people have joined our congregation! Next, after worship was over last Sunday we all, for no apparent reason, gathered in a circle on the West Street side of our sanctuary. And it happened as it sometimes does after "normal" worship. I felt the Spirit of God linger, well after the benediction, as we talked. While maintaining social distancing, we too lingered in that circle and enjoyed one another's company.

I look forward to lingering with our entire congregation in the future. Until then, during these strange and different days at graveside services, in our sanctuary, and elsewhere, *Gloria in excelsis Deo* – glory to God in the highest!

We also work to keep the lines of communication open through phone calls, our church's Facebook page, our bi-monthly "Window," and the "Window in Between." We've been helping some of our folks learn to navigate Facebook for the first time, and, since some of our Sunday School classes and our youth group are meeting virtually through an online platform called Zoom, we've been helping a bit with that too. Our deacons had their first Zoom meeting last night! (April 21)

Since we are currently without a secretary, I've been spending a good bit of time in our main office, going through files and organizing. (I do love to organize!) Rest assured that I am very careful with every file, notebook, pamphlet, and sheet of paper.

Going through these materials has served as a reminder of how strong and vibrant our church has been for over 215 years. In 1928, just one year before the beginning of the Great Depression, our forebearers broke ground to build our current sanctuary, fellowship hall, and initial educational space. Nine years and three months later—before the end of the Great Depression—the building was complete!

Fast forwarding quite a few years, I began to recognize names from my childhood days in the church. I remembered Sunday School teachers, mission group leaders, choir directors, and nursery workers. I smiled at the pictures of women decked out in hats and furs. I chuckled at the pictures of men gathered in the "smoking section" outside the Main St. door near the elevator. I enjoyed reading programs from banquets, concerts, socials, musicals, weddings, and receptions. And I have loved reading about our church's successful ministries that have continued long after I left Ahoskie in the early 1980's.

With each document and picture giving testimony to the strength of FBC Ahoskie's ministry, I began to breathe a bit easier in regard to our current circumstance. Yes, today is the 24th day we've been sheltering in place. Yes, we miss being together in our beautiful church building. But, our ministry remains strong. We're still "gathering" for worship every Sunday. We're still checking on our brothers and sisters and praying for one another. We're still being good stewards. We are the First Baptist Church of Ahoskie, and we're going to be all right.


#### Welcome New Member
