Need a Refill?

When I graduated college, I had a job waiting tables at Satterfield's restaurant in Shelby, NC. The restaurant is now closed. The lessons learned from that job, however, remain. One lesson: check in with people, let them know they have not been forgotten. Thus, it was my custom after I took the diners' orders to check back in periodically. I would say, "Everything okay?", "Can I refill your drink?", "Your food is on the way." I did a good job and most customers rewarded my efforts!

The purpose of this writing then is to touch base, to bring you up to date on a couple of important issues. First, you may recall that just as the pandemic broke out our church voted to invest approximately \$300,000 (\$230,000 of which we have now and \$70,000 of which we will raise) into renovating our sanctuary and construction of a green space on the North Street lot to begin immediately, with kitchen upgrades and fellowship hall improvements to follow.

Even though we had the green light to proceed immediately with the sanctuary remodel and the construction of the green space, our church leadership thought it best to wait and see how our church finances fared due to the nationwide shutdowns and quarantines. Three months later, the good news is that our church remains financially stable. Thank you for your continued commitment to give of your tithes and offerings to the work of our beloved congregation, especially during a time when we are unable to physically meet for worship and other activities.

Due to our stable financial situation then, your church leadership has decided to move forward with sanctuary renovations. We anticipate that the renovations will begin next week. It has not escaped any of us that this is a perfect time to work on the sanc-

tuary as we currently are not all meeting in the sanctuary. We just thought it wise to wait a bit in order to discern our financial situation. We have done just that. You have continued with your faithful financial support. Therefore, it is time to move forward!

The next obvious question: when will we be back in the sanctuary? This question has, at least, two sides to it. First is the construction side. We anticipate the work to take around three months. Thus, this would have the sanctuary ready for occupancy sometime in October. The second side of the question is: when can we resume regular worship services safely? As of now there is no vaccine for the coronavirus and the numbers of infected people in North Carolina are on the rise.

Our transition committee has been working diligently to put safety measures in place so that those who want to meet in person, before a vaccine is in place and even as the numbers rise, can do so. In order to help us make an informed decision about when and how to begin to physically reassemble in our sanctuary (or the fellowship hall if we begin to reassemble before the sanctuary is complete), you should have received a survey from the transition committee seeking your input about when and how to begin to reassemble in our church facilities. We need to know the temperature of the congregation – what exactly would you like to do, are you comfortable returning for in-person worship, are you willing to wear a mask in order to do so, is live stream sufficient for now, etc. Please do respond to the survey as soon as possible.

Okay, just want you to know your food is on the way. Please, no tip this time!


Sanctuary Renovation Info

Spearman & Hawkins, the Charlotte based company with whom we have a long-standing partnership, will come the week of June 29 to remove the exposed pipes, seal the pipe chambers, and cover the organ console. Therefore,

this Sunday, June 28 will be the last time we'll hear our organ until the renovation is completed.
