+CHIMES OF THE TRINITY



The season of Christmastide began on December 25 and ends on January 5, the 12^{th} day of Christmas. The Epiphany of the Lord occurs on the following day each year. We will observe Epiphany on January 10.

In order to provide a safe and healthy environment for all worshipers, please abide by the following guidelines.

- •Masks should be worn at all times, everywhere in the building.
- ◆Though there will be no congregational singing, you're invited to stand and sing in your heart to the Lord.
- •Should you need to exit during the service, please exit by the doors on either side of the chancel.

- ◆Please depart row by row, beginning with rows nearest the chancel. You may exit by the doors on either side of the chancel, or the vestibule door at the West & Main corner. Please practice social distancing as you depart.
