Thoughts on Two Sunday Morning Worship Services

I do not know what to expect as we begin with two worship services on Sunday, February 7. Our church can be rather quiet at times. For example, several months ago we moved the sermon from the end of the worship experience to the middle. I have heard one comment about this move. A gentleman informed me he likes the move because he is more

alert earlier in the service! Can you guess who made this comment? Right - Charles Freeman! In relation to the coming addition of the 8:30 am Sunday worship service, I have heard Ascribe to the LORD from only two people. Both indicated that, even independent of covid concerns, they find the earlier gathering time attractive.

One of those two persons expressed his opinion that two services will increase attendance – I prefer the word participation to attendance. In other words, under normal non-covid circumstances when you add the number of people together from the

8:30am and the 11am service, that number will be greater than if we just had the one 11am service. As I write. I can see some of you shaking your heads in disagreement with this sentiment. Before covid hit, I heard some of our people recall the summer – perhaps as long as 15 years ago – when our church tried two Sunday morning worship services. The way the story comes to me, we had several people who requested an earlier Sunday morning worship service for the summer. So, we offered an early service. However, the participation was very low. As I understand it, some wanted an earlier service during the summer so they could then have the rest of

the day for traditional summer activities.

Here we are, around 15 years later, trying a second Sunday morning worship service again. However, the circumstances are different – very different. It is not summer. Rather we are in the dead of winter. Furthermore, the purpose of the second service is not even to increase participation. Rather, the purpose of the second worship service this time around is to accommodate more people safely as they desire to return to sanctuary worship. As I have said be-

> fore, I suspect it will be a while before people are comfortable sitting close to other people outside of their immediate family. Even so, I am hopeful that as more and more people become vaccinated, more and more people will return to sanctuary worship. My desire is that we continue to have a safe sanctuary environment for people when they return.

I responded to the gentleman referred to above who offered his opinion that two Sunday morning worship services will increase attendance with, "I heard we had two services a long time ago and the early service

just did not catch on." He said, "Yes, but this is a different day." I think we can all agree that this is a different day! If, in fact, our two morning worship services increase our overall participation level, then I say let us continue with two services after covid passes off the scene. However, if as in the past participation does not increase, then once the threat of covid passes we will go back to one 11am worship gathering.






Psalm 29:2, NRSV
