- 3 Our climb out of covid will be slow, I think. Remember our goal in terms of numbers: For 2019, we average 181.34 people in worship. For 2020, before covid struck, we averaged 173 people in worship. I am optimistic that we will return to this level of worship participation. In fact, as I said Sunday, I would like to see us average 200 people in worship post-covid. Perhaps, two services will help us do this!

Ash Wednesday Worship February 17 6:15 pm in the Sanctuary

As with all our worship services, we are adapting our Ash Wednesday service to meet Covid-19 guidelines. Reservations are required, and masks must be worn.

As the children and women's Bible study will be meeting at their usual 5:00 pm time, we hope they will plan to remain for the Ash Wednesday service.

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) that lead up to Easter. This first day of Lent and the following liturgical season are marked with a somberness as Christians reflect on their mortality, their sinfulness, and the dying of self that comes with new life in Christ.

Ashes are a biblical reminder of our mortality: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The spreading of ashes on foreheads is a visible reminder of this. The ashes also represent sorrow and repentance for sin.

Two Sunday Morning Worship Services 8:30 and 11:00 am



On Sunday February 7, we began offering two Sunday morning worship services. The first worship service begins at 8:30am; the second at 11am. The 11am service is live-streamed on Facebook, and broadcast on our local radio station, WQDK, 99.3. Reservations will still be required. And, of course, we will still wear masks and observe appropriate distancing. As it stands now, there is not a nursery for the 8:30am service. There is a nursery for the 11am service.

From the Associate Pastor

As I've been planning for Lent 2021, I recalled how, in 2020, we had traveled only a few weeks into the Lenten season before our world was shut down due to the Covid-19 pandemic. It was on the third Sunday in Lent, March 15, when we first limited the number of in-person worshipers. Both the Sanctuary Choir and Chairo were scheduled to sing, so those musicians, a sound system operator, and the ministers were the only folks in the sanctuary. Everyone else worshiped with us via the radio broad- again. We will continue to love God with the same cast. (We had not yet broadened our media savvy to persistence God chooses and claims us. include Facebook live-streaming.) It was certainly the most unusual Lenten season any of us had ex-

perienced. Who would have thought that, a year later, we would begin yet another Lenten season still under the restrictions of the Covid-19 pandemic? Yet, this is our reality.

With Ash Wednesday just around the corner (February 17), we're coming full circle as we begin the 2021 Lenten season, still under Covid-19 pandemic conditions.

Last year we were blindsided. This year, we enter the Lenten season knowing what pandemic life looks like. In light of almost a year of pandemic suffering, the Lenten practices of sacrifice (giving up) and embrace (taking on) have the potential to challenge us in ways that move us significantly toward greater Christlikeness.

As I was considering what my Lenten journey might look like this year, I came across the study, "Again & Again," written specifically for 2021 by the creative team at The Sanctified Art. I'm using it for my Lenten journey, and invite you to read below the artistic team's description, and consider if this study may be a good fit for your journey, too.

In Lent, we're reminded that, again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again. Again and again, the story of Jesus on the cross repeats—every time lives are taken unjustly, every time the powerful choose corruption and violence, every time individuals forget how to love. With exacerbation we exclaim, "Again?! How long, O God?" And yet, in the midst of the chaos of our lives, God offers a sacred refrain: "I choose you. I love you. I will lead you to repair." Again and

again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward.

This theme provides a clear invitation in a time when much is unclear. Even if worshiping apart, we continue to come to God again and again with our prayers, our dreams, our hopes, and our doubts. Even if from a distance, we will continue to be community to one another—especially when it's hard—by choosing each other over and over

> In this season, we need rituals both old and new—to remember and be transformed. Embodied practice builds muscle memory. Repetition helps retrain our neural pathways. We encourage you to walk through these weekly readings and prompts at your own pace throughout the season, following the rhythm that works best for you. May the art, reflections, and poetry strengthen and

stretch you, shaping you into a more faithful disciple.

This Lent, may God's steadfast love cradle our laments. May God's grace wash over our weariness. And may we bring all of who we are to God—trusting that God will meet us, time and again, along the way.
