Nonetheless, I have so missed looking into the eyes of our people. Perhaps, this is the reason I find myself so refreshed with the resumption of a more normal afternoon visitation routine. Now that I am fully vaccinated, and so many others are as well, I am more and more comfortable spending time with people in hos-

pital rooms and nursing homes and living rooms and at kitchen tables. Of course, it is a tremendous

out of my mouth, "I want to be a good pastor to you. the days ahead." Of course, I wanted to be a good pastor to our people before Covid. However, I do not recall that I was in the habit of plainly stating this desire to people. Indeed, absence makes the heart grow fonder.

However, other situations are not as clear cut. Someone may strongly desire to hear from their pastor, and I simply do not know. 


