What's in a Name?

What's in a name? Apparently more than I once thought.

You might find the story of my name interesting. My mother tells me that she never picked out a boy's name. Remember, my birth occurred back in the day before gender reveals were in vogue, or possible. My mother was convinced she was going to give birth to a baby girl. And, apparently, she wanted to give birth to a baby girl. What can *I* say about this? I too wanted a baby girl! My mother had settled only on a girl's name – Monica Gail Gilliam.

So, when I was born there was a bit of a scramble for a name. My father would not allow his son to be named Monica Gail Gilliam. Thanks Dad! My mother then agreed to give me the name of my father and grandfather – Paul Robert Gilliam. However, she did not want to call me by either Paul or Robert. My mother's friend had recently given birth to a boy. This little fella too shared a name with his father and grandfather. And his mother did not want to call him by his ancestral name. Therefore, since this baby boy was the third male to hold the name, my mother's friend decided to call him, "Trey." It is a logical nickname since "Trey" means "three." Thus, I too became "Trey" from day one ... or maybe day two.

A lot of people are satisfied with a nickname for the entirety of their life. And at first, I was satisfied as well. However, "Trey" has been a source of frustration throughout my life. In school, on the first day of class, the teacher asked if Paul were present. And each year, I had to say, "yes, but I go by Trey." When I graduated high school, *my* name was called – Paul Robert Gilliam III. No one knew that guy. The same with graduate school graduation and doctoral graduation. I sign checks and

other official documents, not Trey Gilliam, but Paul R. Gilliam III.

When Lou Ann was pregnant with Matty Grace (the name on her birth certificate), we decided to forego modern technology and wait until birth to learn the gender of our child. Lou Ann likes surprises! Even though I wanted a girl, we had decided on a boy's name as well – Turner Paul Gilliam. Lou Ann insisted that whatever we name the child, we call the child. Turner never materialized. However, after my experience with "Trey," I so agreed that the child's name is what we call the child!

As I have aged, I have come to embrace my name — my real name, my official name, my birth certificate name more and more. My grandfather and my father are both deceased. It looks as if I will be the last Paul Robert Gilliam. I have thought, for years now, about using *my* name and ditching the nickname. At my 50th birthday, I decided to put if off no longer and just do it!

I put this off for years because I knew the transition would be awkward and frustrating. And, indeed, it has! Thus, I want to thank those of you who are really trying to make the transition with me from "Trey" to "Paul." I am most appreciative. Someone, in a moment of irritation, said to me recently, "Most people do not change their name at 50." I politely responded, "I have not changed *my* name. I am simply using *my* name." And so it is. These days I go by my real name, my actual name, my birth certificate name, the name I share with Paul R. Gilliam Sr. and Paul R. Gilliam Jr.

Someone said to me, just this week, "You look like a Paul." I think so too.
