Déjà vu

By now, word has spread far and wide about my return to Chowan University as the Director of the Religion program and Professor of Religion. Facebook is good for getting the word out! This news should sound somewhat familiar – perhaps it engenders a déjà vu experience of sorts. It is Chowan that brought the Gilliams to Hertford County in 2011. I came as Assistant Professor of Religion. Soon after we arrived Lou Ann was hired as Chowan's Director of Church and Community Relations – a position she continues to hold.

While serving in my first position with Chowan, I continued to assist churches as supply preacher, Wednesday night Bible study leader, and interim pastor. This is what enabled our paths to cross. In February 2017, I became your interim pastor. In October 2017, I became your permanent pastor. At first, I continued teaching at Chowan. However, I soon decided that holding down two jobs was a bit much. Therefore, long story short, I resigned my position at Chowan in order to focus more completely on my church responsibilities.

While my return to Chowan as the Director of the Religion program and Professor of Religion might, indeed, seem like a déjà vu experience, there are significant differences this time around. First, our only child is now away at college. The empty nest frees up significant time I have not had for the last 20 years or so (though I sure do miss that kid!). Second, I am now established as your pastor. I know our congregation well. And I know the surrounding community much better than I did in 2017. In other words, I no longer must ask Anita where the light switches are. Well, maybe every once in a while, still! And, finally and unfortunately, our church is smaller than it was in

2017. I am pleased that it is *not* a rarity for someone to join our church or for us to step into the baptismal waters. However, our gains are simply not matching our losses. Last Sunday after worship, one of our faithful members said to me, "We are really thinning, aren't we?" I responded, "Yes, we are." For what it is worth, I think an answer to all the declining congregations in our area is for congregations, who are generally likeminded, to join with one another. However, I have discovered first-hand that the resistance to this idea is fierce.

Perhaps then I should pause here and ask the inactive members of First Baptist Ahoskie to please come back. We need you! And, if I may be so bold as to say, you need us too. If you would like to talk about whatever may have upset you in the past, that caused you to withdraw from the life of our church, please do contact me. I welcome the conversation.

This time around I have a different position with Chowan. I am the director of the religion program. This means I have the opportunity to shape and mold the program. I am tasked with building the program, providing leadership and vision for the program. This excites me. Déjà vu – well, sort of.

Please know that First Baptist Ahoskie will not suffer because of these added responsibilities. What it does mean, however, is that I will get earlier starts on my day than usual. No problem there – the timing is just right.


Chairo Music Ensemble

The Ronald McDonald House program helps reduce stress and financial burden for families when they must travel far from home to access medical care for their child.




A collection box will be located in the 1st floor hallway. Let's gift the RMH with a boatload of pop tabs by the March 21, 2022 deadline!
