# **Preaching and Cooking**

The preaching task shares some common ground with the cooking task. The preparation of a good meal for a flock of people takes considerable effort and time. The flock of people, for whom the meal is prepared, consumes the meal in a short period of time. If conversation is good, perhaps it takes a group 20 minutes to eat a meal consisting of salad, meat, sides, and dessert. If conversation lags, 10 minutes. Preaching is similar. The preparation of a sermon takes considerable effort and time. And, the sermon lasts, my sermons at least, anywhere from 20 minutes to 25 minutes. The nice thing about the preparation of a large meal is that, often, there are leftovers. And, sometimes, leftovers can last quite a while – perhaps up to a week.

It is a bit different with preaching. Usually, there are no leftovers. However, as we have just concluded a sermon series from the psalms, I can offer a review of the ground we have covered. Leftovers of sorts, I suppose. So here is a review of the psalms we have covered, with sermon title, in numerical order.

Psalm 8 – "The Next Step" – We are to embrace our responsibilities as rulers over God's creation.

Psalm 30 – "When It Happens" – When God turns our mourning into dancing, we are to give thanks to God. We are not to gloat in our good fortune. Nor are we to feel guilty.

Psalm 98 – "Is it Time?" – We are challenged by the psalmist to sing a new song to God.

Psalm 100 – "I Still See It" – Our congregation, post-covid, can regain its momentum in route to becoming a vibrant worshipping community – entering His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise.

Psalm 113 – "A Good Question" – Let's stop living our lives as if anything other than God in Christ can fill our emptiness.

Psalm 116 – "Experiencing God" – The psalmist challenges us to seek more than an intellectual relationship with God. We are to pursue an experiential relationship with God.

Psalm 121 – "The Voice of Experience" – We are reassured that God is our keeper, that God does not slumber or sleep.

Psalm 130 – "A Lot of Forgiveness" – We are reminded that God does not count our sins. Rather, God forgives our sins.

Psalm 131 – "Broken" – We are challenged, after we have questioned God and yelled at God, to let go and trust God.

I have found this sermon series most helpful in my efforts to live the Christian life. I hope you have had a similar experience. Perhaps, as we prepare to move on from this sermon series into the Advent season, you will take some time to reread and reflect again upon these psalms. This is the closest I have to leftovers to offer you!
