It is not uncommon for someone new to ioin our church via profession of faith or transfer of letter at the conclusion of Sunday morning worship. While we do not have someone join every Sunday, there are stretches of three or four weeks in a row where we accept new members. The reception of new members indicates that we are a healthy congregation. I must admit that I am sometimes surprised at the frequency with which we have people join our church due to the overall decline of the church in America and our increasingly secular society. Again, thanks be to God!

So, what is the source(s) of our recent changing face? While we mourn the closure of the Methodist church and the Presbyterian church, here in Ahoskie, we are thrilled that a sizeable handful of those folks now worship with us. Some have officially joined our church, others are making plans to do so, and others will probably wait a while before they join if they join at all. It matters not, these people are a part of our changing face.

We now have Chowan students who worship with us on a regular basis. One of them, Brayden Conboy, joined the church! This may be a first as no one can remember a Chowan student joining our church in the past. The college students add life to our congregation. It felt different last Sunday as the students are now on Christmas break and, therefore, were not with us. Thanks be to God for our Chowan students!

We also have people from the Ahoskie community that are new to our church. We welcomed Ashlee' Perry to our congregation recently. And word has it that another family might join our church soon. In addition to these people, we have other families who are regular participants in worship with us. Thanks be to God!

Indeed, the face of our church is changing. For congregations to survive and thrive generation after generation, this must occur. Have you noticed it?
