Sandra Kaye Outlaw Meyers, age 73, passed away Sunday, January 9, 2022, near her home in Hampton, Georgia.

Sandra was born in Ahoskie, NC, and leaves behind her beautiful 100-year-old mother, Nancy Lowe Outlaw, and her baby brother, Scott (Lisa) Outlaw in her hometown. She is survived by her son, Matthew (Liz) Meyers, and two grandsons, Tyler and Austin. She was also loved by many nieces and nephews.

Born May 20, 1948, Sandra was baptized on May 11, 1958, by the congregation of First Baptist Church of Ahoskie. She graduated from Ahoskie High School in 1966.
