#### An Invitation

In February, I will enter my seventh year as your pastor. After the completion of six years, I know our congregation well. And you know me well. We've come along way since 2017. I remember my early days among you. Claire Presley was chair of the deacons. She and Billy took me around to church members homes and introduced me to many of our members. I did a lot of visiting in 2017. Six years later I find myself in a different place. There is no longer a need for me to get to know the congregation, as in the beginning. Over the past six years it has been my privilege to walk with you through all the phases of this life – birth, marriage, family celebrations, sickness, and death. Thank you for allowing me to be an extended member of your family. Please know, I do not lose sight of the privilege of pastoral ministry.

Years ago, I heard a scholar/pastor observe that some people want a close relationship with the pastor. Other people are content with simply shaking the pastor's hand after worship on Sundays. Or, whatever interaction may naturally develop, when there is a pastoral need. Therefore, according to this gentleman, the pastor should allow the people to dictate the nature of the pastor/parishioner relationship. According to this proposal, the onus is on the laity to initiate a deeper relationship with the clergy. I do appreciate this perspective. However, as I approach the completion of six years with you, I want to take a slightly different approach.

If you are in that category of people who would like to know your pastor better, I invite you to schedule an appointment with me. We can gather at my office, your house, over lunch, or wherever works best for you. While we can talk about anything when together, perhaps we could center our conversation on Christian faith in some fashion. I spend a lot of time talking with people about football games and grandchildren and illnesses. Very rarely, oddly enough, do I have conversations with people *explicitly* about Christian faith – about God, Jesus, Holy Spirit, church, evangelization, baptism, communion, etc. This is one of the reasons my appreciation of preaching has grown through the years. The Sunday morning sermon is the one time I know the conversation will be about, in one fashion or another, God's revelation to us in Jesus the Christ. Perhaps our meeting could be an extension of the Sunday morning sermon experience. Indeed, are there any theological issues that you would you to talk about with your pastor?

So, as we enter our seventh year together, would you like to get together? We can talk about last night's game or the weather or the latest movie. However, I would rather talk about Christian faith, about God, about Jesus, about the Holy Spirit, about the Bible, about communion, about the church, about baptism, about God's activity in the world, about God's activity in your life, and you get the idea.

Any takers? If so, just get in touch with me and we will set something up.

### **Epiphany—Star Words**

On Sunday, January 8, 2023, we celebrated Epiphany Sunday by beginning a new Christian



practice called Star Words. With the story of the magi's search for Jesus as our guide, each worshiper received a paper star on which a word was written. Just as a star led the magi to Jesus, it is hoped that our star words will lead us into a deeper relationship with Jesus throughout 2023.

These star words are one lens that may provide a way to look for God in our midst, both actively and in hindsight. They invite a new prayer rhythm of reflection that can be a powerful new way to connect with God through Christ. Also, by not choosing our star, we engage in the spiritual task of receiving. It is not we who are in control in that moment. Instead, we trust that God is present, and we let go of our desire to control.

I loved watching the children's faces as they received their paper stars during the Children's Time. And it was another beautiful sight to see *all* worshipers receive their stars from the children during the postlude. We'll be engaging with one another throughout the year about our star words. If you don't have one, I'll be glad to give you one.
